	As advised by a member, secretariat to ask risk assessment author to categorise the section relating to raw drinking milk as "high uncertainty" as the paper is unclear on the number of people that drink raw milk in the 2 specified areas. This should be reflected in the paper's summary statement/final remark.
	Secretariat to draw the risk assessment author's attention to a point raised on the risk assessment Actioned. Members regarding the current ACMSF classification of overall microbiological risk from RDM (page 1: paragraph 2). This should be corrected to "medium" not "low".
