| 8.7 | Changes to plant protection product and biocide MRLs: potential impact on food safety The Committee agreed to explore the availability of evidence in relation to microbiological food safety that can be employed by the FSA to underpin its position in its negotiation with other Member States and the European Commission. Dr Dan Tucker, Dr Gwen Lowe and Ms Heather Lawson were asked to meet to suggest the types of data that would be available that might show that changes are occurring in process hygiene control systems. | Following investigation, the members asked to consider what types of data could be available that might show that changes are occurring in process hygiene control systems recognised this was an impracticable exercise as they could not readily identify any data source that could be used for a comparison of different cleaning products. The members also questioned the validity of such a before and after comparison of industry routine data in a working environment that was not controlled scientifically. It was agreed that any data in relation to the above would potentially be difficult to interpret. |

| 9.4 | From the human data update members noted that the number of human Campylobacteriosis cases appears to continue to be dropping (it has decreased to the lowest rate reported in the last ten years).
