4.1	<p>Minutes of 73rd meeting</p> <p>Members approved minutes as a correct record of meeting subject to a minor amendment to paragraph 18.1 to correct the accuracy of Mr Tom Miller's comments in the public questions and answer session. Secretariat asked to arrange for the minutes to be placed on the website.</p>	Actioned.
5	<p>Matter arising</p> <p>Concerning recent data on "D" and "Z" values for High Temperature Short Time treatment of milk, Ms Hoad agreed to provide the derived "D" values from the Kells & Lear paper to Mr Kyriakides.</p>	Actioned. Paper was forwarded to Mr Kyriakides.
6.8	<p>Horizon scanning</p> <p>The Committee agreed the horizon scanning proposal as suggested by Mr Kyriakides, Professor McDowell, Mr Bassett and Ms Buller. To progress this subject members agreed that there may be the need to draw on the expertise from other FSA Scientific Advisory Committees (SAC). Members recommended that paper (ACM/1007) is submitted to the FSA.</p>	Work in progress. Secretariat liaising with other SAC secretariats and the FSA on taking forward ACMSF horizon scanning proposals.
7.6	<p>Raw Milk</p> <p>Following evidence presented by the FSA on the health risks to consumers associated with unpasteurised milk for direct human consumption, the Committee indicated that if data on changing sales routes is gathered (by the FSA) there may be a need to review the risks from raw drinking milk.</p>	Work in progress. FSA is currently considering the need for data on sales of raw drinking milk in light of the evolving market.

11.3	<p>Openness</p> <p>The Committee endorsed the secretariat's proposals on making the deliberations of ACMSF subgroups more transparent. Implementation was scheduled for the following subgroup meetings.</p>	<p>Actioned.
